

## Female student assaulted in campus parking lot

The campus police at Vol State reported that a female student was physically assaulted last Thursday in the parking lot between the Wallace Health Sciences Building and the Maddox Business Building.

The report stated that the victim was robbed around 6:55 a.m.

Details have not been released pending an ongoing investigation of the case, however authorities believe

the assault was an isolated incident.

The victim was reported to have received minor injuries and was released from the hospital the same day.

The campus police are looking for any information regarding the case, especially students who may have witnessed the assault.

A campus police escort service is available 24 hours a day to any destination on campus for all students. Students who utilize the service will be escorted by a uniformed officer.
