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BIZARRE OCCURENCES

A disabled Danish man is fighting for the government to pay for visits to his home by prostitutes, according to the BBC.

Torben Hansen suffers from cerebral palsy, which severely affects his speech and mobility. Because of the disability, he is unable to go out to see prostitutes, thus paying extra for them to come to his home.

"I want [the Danish government] to cover the extra expenses for the prostitutes to get here, because it's a lot more expensive getting them to come to my home rather than me going to a brothel," Hansen told the BBC. "It's a necessity for me. I can't move very well, and it's impossible for me to go there."

Hansen began seeing prostitutes after he attended a course at a social center. There, satisfying needs was encouraged.

Kristen Brosboel, a Social Democrat member of Danish Parliament said, "I disagree with the fact that we should support his visits with a prostitute with tax money."

In Miami, officials discovered the remains of a 13-foot Burmese python

and its attempted meal of a six-foot alligator, according to AZCentral.com of Arizona.

According to officials, many residents abandon pet pythons in the Florida Everglades, resulting in an unnatural habitat for the snakes.

"There had been some hope that alligators can control Burmese pythons," said Frank Mazzotti, a University of Florida wildlife professor.

The python was found with the alligator's hindquarters protruding from the snake's midsection. Officials assumed the alligator had attempted to claw its way out of the snake while it was being digested.

While it is unknown how many pythons inhabit the Everglades, over 150 have been captured over the last two years.

Not paying a \$25 annual firefighters fee in International Falls, Minn. can result in firefighters ignoring a burning house.

According to The Star Tribune, Carl Berg's burned to the ground as firefighters did nothing. Berg had not paid the fee for rural fire protection.

"You either buy it or you don't have it," said Don Billig, the Rural Fire Protection Association secretary said. "You buy the fire protection up here and you have it."

"My job is to put out fires, not to watch them burn," disagreed Fire Chief Jerry Jensen. "I don't want this to happen again."

Initially, firefighters put out the fire to ensure all the house's inhabitants escaped safely. Once the fire was rekindled and no one was in danger, however, they allowed the house to burn to the ground.

Scientists have trained dolphins to sing the Batman theme, according to ABC.net of Australia.

"Humans are sensitive to rhythms embedded in sequences of sounds, but we typically consider this skill to be part of processing for language and music, cognitive domains that we consider to be uniquely human," said Professor Heidi Harley of New College of Florida in Sarasota.

Scientists played the harmony for the dolphins and trained them to connect the unique rhythms to a visual

stimulation. In this case, the visual stimulus was a Batman doll.

"When we presented him with a Batman doll, he received a fish for producing a specific rhythm, in this case, a short sound and a long sound," said Harley.

Indian scientists discovered a set of stars traveling extremely fast around a black hole in the Andromeda Galaxy from Hubble telescope imagery.
